Christopher O. L. H. Porter is the program chair for Graduate Programs in the Business of Medicine at the Kelley School of Business (Indiana University) and a OneAmerica Endowed Chair and Professor of Management. He also serves as the Research Coordinator for the Business Law, Marketing, and Management areas in Indianapolis' interdisciplinary department. In addition to his roles within Kelley, he is an Adjunct Professor in Psychology in the School of Science at Indiana University Purdue University Indianapolis.

Prior to joining Kelley in 2012, Christopher was on faculty at Texas A&M University where he taught business negotiations at the undergraduate, graduate (Master's and MBA), and executive levels and business leadership at the undergraduate and graduate (Master's and Ph.D.) levels. He currently teaches business leadership and global healthcare studies in Kelley's Business of Medicine MBA programs.

Christopher's primary research interests include dyadic and team leadership, motivation, teamwork, and team composition. He is also interested in organizational entry/exit, feedback interventions, and performance management. His research has been published in *Academy of Management Journal*, *Academy of Management Review*, *Journal of Applied Psychology*, *Journal of Management*, *Police Quarterly*, and *The Leadership Quarterly*. Christopher currently serves on the editorial boards of *Academy of Management Journal*, *Journal of Applied Psychology*, and *The Leadership Quarterly*. He is also an Associate Editor at *Journal of Management*.

In addition to his Ph.D. in Business Administration from Michigan State University, Christopher holds a master's degree in Criminal Justice with a specialization in policing and law enforcement (Michigan State University) and a bachelor's degree in Psychology (Morehouse College). In addition to his academic experience, he has worked as a consultant with the National Juvenile Detention Association and the Michigan Council on Crime and Delinquency. He has also consulted with a number of criminal justice agencies and with private and public sector companies on issues such as leadership, team composition, performance management, organizational entry, turnover, and reemployment among others.

Porter has been faculty with the Beaumont Physician Leadership Academy since 2019.
